Role Purpose

The Head of Standards is responsible for ensuring the consistent application and continuous improvement of flight operations standards across the organisation. This role oversees regulatory compliance, manages internal safety and quality programs, and engages with industry bodies to align company practices with global best standards. Working closely with the Flight Operations department and other key stakeholders, the Head of Standards plays a critical role in maintaining operational excellence and supporting the safe, efficient delivery of aviation services.

2. Core Values

Safe, Efficient, Quality, Service

Core values are the principles that continue to define the company culture and guide daily interaction and decision making. Each employee has a personal responsibility to recognize the behaviours that support these principles and put them into daily practice.

3. Key Deliverables, Duties and Responsibilities

- Ensure standardisation and continuous improvement across all Flight Operations activities.
- Maintain regulatory compliance and liaise with CASA and other authorities.
- Oversee internal safety and quality programs, including LOSA and auditing.
- Manage updates to operational documentation and industry standards.
- Support flight operations leadership and contribute to strategic development of best practices.

Operational and Regulatory Compliance

- Maintain flying currency on a type or class of helicopter that is used to conduct a significant proportion of PHI's air transport operations, as directed by the HOFO.
- Under direction from the HOFO, Alternate HOFO, and Head of Training and Checking (HOTC), manage continuous improvement of the Flight Operations manual to ensure regulatory compliance.
- Monitor and review amendments to CASA documentation (CASRs, MOS, ACs, AMC/GM).
- Maintain and update Web Manuals compliance files.
- Monitor AIP SUP publications and ensure operational adjustments are made accordingly.
- Submit and track all Part 119, 133 & 138 change notifications and applications to CASA.
- Attend CASA flying operations seminars and liaise with CASA and other authorities as required.

Standardisation and Continuous Improvement

- Coordinate and manage the standardisation of Flight Operations across Australia.
- Collaborate with the HOFO, Alternate HOFO, and Head of Training and Checking (HOTC) to implement best practices.
- Review and update non-regulatory standards (IOGP, HeliOffshore) and maintain compliance documentation.

Advise HOFO/Alternate HOFO of significant changes to standards.

Safety and Quality Oversight

- Under direction from the Alternate HOFO, manage the Line Operations Safety Audit (LOSA) program.
- Assist with auditing of external training providers.

Training and Industry Engagement

- Maintain and develop professional standards, qualifications, and training programs.
- Engage with industry bodies to contribute to the development and review of global best practices.
- Coordinate the company's involvement with HeliOffshore and similar organisations.

Administrative and Support Functions

- Administer Web Manuals and ensure documentation accuracy.
- Support the Flight Operations management team as directed by the HOFO.
- Undertake other Flight Operations tasks as assigned by the HOFO or Alternate HOFO.

- Report any hazards or occurrences and stop any unsafe work.
- Participate in safety activities and meetings.
- Comply with all company policies and procedures.
- Be familiar with the Integrated Management System and its associated manuals such as the SMS Manual, HSE Manual and the Quality Manual.
- Have working knowledge of the Safety Case and Hazard / Risk Management Process.
- Maintain Controls that are described in the Safety Case and the Risk Module software application for which this position is responsible for.
